WANT LEADERS TO FARMERS.

The Farmers of Franklin county have had some severe lessons in the destructiveness of war. Very many had their horses and cattle stolen by the rebels, and many have suffered scarcely less from the desolating tread of our own armies. It is worthy of notice, however, that notwithstanding our proximity to the rebel lines and our constant exposure to incursions by raiding and plundering parties, lands have never depreciated in market, and but few if any of our people have been driven from agricultural pursuits.

The general wealth of our Farmers in this county has been a barrier to their progress. They farm well as a rule—quite as well as do most intelligent agricultural sections of the State; but necessity has never taught progress and they have been only too well contented to farm as did their fathers before them. But inexorable war has brought with it some lessons, and just now impresses them in an imperative manner upon the people of the border, and he is most wise who most profits by them.

Franklin is the most fence-ridden county we know of in Pennsylvania. Our farmers will insist as a rule, upon cutting up their farms into small fields and keeping up miles of fences at an enormous cost of money, labor and land, without any compensation whatever. If it were possible for our people to raise cattle profitably, there would be some excuse for their network of fences, although it would be still unwise and wasteful; but when it is considered that steers cannot be raised in Franklin county for less than double or perhaps triple the price they can be bought on the road in the fall, the folly of keeping up fences should become apparent to any one who understands that two and two make four.

Very many of our farmers have had their farms partially or wholly destroyed by the armies; and to such we would appeal to give some attention to this question solely as one of economy. A majority of the farmers on the line most devastated by military occupation, have to purchase their fencing material, and our own county is not through a supply equal to the demand in a ordinary year.

The southern and eastern sections have hitherto drawn largely upon Adams for rails, generally giving little in return, but the wide-spread destruction of the railroads, has so increased the demand there that the price of rails has gone up fully twenty-five per cent. In addition to this, the price of posts has advanced, and a pair of good post-holes cannot now be located for \$1.25 and not for other things so cheap, all things considered as post-holes. It is consequently that farmers will need to incur such enormous expense and sustain a considerable portion of their losses, by the fence-rows when the rebels experience of non-planting sections is as clearly against fencing and pasturing as the light of day.

Pasturing our heavy clay lands with the work of death. If wet and soft, it becomes a death-brood the surface, it bakes and the air, one of the best of fertilizers, ceases to permeate it. If, however, the soil is almost equal to that for a little or no elasticity, and for all this damage there is no real compensation. We have for two years had all our cattle with excellent grass from the 10th of June to the 1st of September, out from the same about our dwelling houses—in all not over two and a half acres, and a considerable portion of that is so thickly set with heavy fruit trees as to retard the growth of the grass very much. We mow it three times for fuel—just often enough to keep the lawn neat and clean, and cut it again

to make the soil prepare the ground for a light sowing of manure from the 10th of June, which lies on the surface during the winter and is raked off in the spring. By the first of September we have corn stalks ready for the cattle. We plough deeply and manure well about two acres in April, and sow broadcast 33 bushels of corn to the acre about the first of May. It comes up thickly on the ground, grows tall and slender, in the stock, and is the very best feed for cattle in the latter part of August and September, when all other pasture is generally dried up; that could be supplied them.

In this way all our cattle have the very best of fresh, succulent food from June until late in autumn, and no fences are required; no land is damaged; no grass wasted, and the cattle thrive better than in the pasture fields exposed to the heat of summer and tormented by flies. They are stabled in the morning, before the heat of the day, the stable kept dark to exclude flies, although well ventilated, and in the evening they are turned out and fed in the yard and have free range to running water. This two-acre farm land, besides the lawn about the house, supply all the pasture for our cattle five months of the year, while most of our neighbors would destroy fifteen acres of grass, not to count fences and damage to land, in keeping the same number, and then would have good pasture but a short time. This year the rebels and our own military somewhat deranged our operations; but the system has been well tested and its economy and utility have been clearly established. We never pasture horses. They do immense damage to land, and often are more injured than benefited by grazing. Young clover is exhausting to them, and it is seldom that they can be turned out without getting it; and old clover has little more nourishment than straw. They are better in the stable, with good grass cut for them when it is fit for use; and when it is not—when young clover is mixed with it—they are better on hay.

We have thus digressed to enforce the conviction that inside fences are needless, profitless and positively wasteful of land, of labor and of money; and we entreat such of our farmers as have lost fences to learn the lesson of war, and take out all remaining inside fences and make out side fences in the best style. No farmer has yet, so far as we have been advised, tried soiling stock and returned to the old plan; and we feel well assured that no farmer will ever return to division fences after he has fairly tried getting along without them. If the devastation of the last summer by hostile and friendly armies shall teach this important lesson to any considerable number of our farmers, ten years hence the lessons of war will not be regretted, however harsh they seem now.

Another lesson clearly taught by the sad events of the last year, is the necessity of employing mules more generally in our farming operations. They are capable of doing as much ordinary farm work as the horse; are ten-fold more enduring; are never sick and rarely crippled by sprains or other accidents; they live twice as long as the horse, and can be kept on one-half the feed from year to year. The coming winter will be a severe one for our farmers. The rebel occupation of our county during the month of June, lost our people the entire crop of clover hay—the main dependence of our farmers—and feed will be very scarce. If mules had been substituted generally for the horses stolen from our county, there would be little or no inconvenience felt, for they would winter very well on dry straw and work well with a little strong feed added. They can now be bought almost as cheaply as good horses, and it seems to us that every argument points to the economy and utility of adopting them instead of horses on our farms.

Such are a few of the lessons of war to farmers. Let them not fail to profit by them.
