

He had certainly one-third more efficient men when he crossed the Rapidan than could be marshaled against him; and to retreat without battle four days before his rations were exhausted, is one of the most lamentable exhibitions of weakness even of the many which have fallen to the hard lot of the Army of the Potomae. If he found his enemy too well prepared for him, then he was out generaled; and a Napoleon would have sought some other route in the vast territory of Virginia, rather than to halt three days in mingled heaitation and preparation to carry the line of Mine Run by assault. Considering that the destruction of Lee's army is now the great necessity to terminate the war, the magnitude of Meade's failure can sarcely be estimated. Had Lee been shattered simultaneously with the rout of Bragg, no human power could have recented Longstreet, and winter would have come upon the South without a lingering hope of the success of the rebellion. The plants consisted of the following varieties, viz: Connections, Pennsylvanis, Viginias and Hewams. The teps were frequently out off so as to allow the leaves to grow large. The labor expended in heeling, sto., was equal to the daily labor of two persons during the three months or more of the tobacco season. The first crop was cut off the ground in the laster part of August; and when dry it will make about 4,000 lbs. The tobacco is of very good quality. The second crop was easily worked; and turned out tolerably well. The whole, 'lidework,' make several hundred pounds. Season's when the frosts do not come early, the second crop can be made to pay considerably more than the expenses incurred in working both crops. From the foregoing, it will be seen that raising tobacco in this county will pay. Other and larger experiments will be made next summer.
