

THE CLEAVELAND CONVENTION.

A formal call has finally been issued for the "People's National Convention" at Cleaveland on Tuesday, the 31st of May. It is signed by some forty-dregentlemen, headed by Senator B. Gratz Brown, of Missouri, and six signers from Peenasylvania—viz Messra Andrew Humbert, Wm. Morris Davis, E. M. Davis, William F. Johnston, and Nathaniel P. Sawyer. Of Mr. Humbert we have never before heard that we can recollect. Wm. Morris Davis was chosen to Congress by Montgomery and part of Philadelphia in 1860, and E. M. Davis is probably his brother. William F. Johnston is widely known as one of our most uncaccessful politicians ever since, and Mr. Sawyer is simply his echo. So far as the names are concerned, they carry little political weight, and the gentlemen are really without condituencies. There are doubtless men in Pennsylvania who preser General Fremont for the Presidency, but there is no considerable number outside of the Democracy, who wish a nomination to be made at Cleaveland solely with the view of defeating the re-election of President Lincoln.
