The press interview between the President and Secretary Seward and the rebel commission, of Fort Sumner, resulted in nothing. The conference occupied four hours. The President and Mr. Seward returned to Washington on Saturday. Since reports of the interview between the President and the rebel commission are published, the President is said to have stated that he should continue the war to compel obedience to the Constitution, on the basis of Union. The commission returned knowing that overtures must now come from them. Negotiation was made. The war will be pushed with new vigor.

Both Houses of Congress have decided that the vote of eleven States—Virginia, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Texas, Arkansas, and Tennessee—shall be counted in the vote for President and Vice President. The States were not in a condition to vote on the 8th of November last.

Gov. Harris, of Louisiana, has issued a proclamation to the people of Louisiana, and Tennessee on the adoption of a measure abolishing Slavery in these States, and appointing the 24th inst. as a holiday in honor of this event.

Passage of the Amendment to the Constitution. The House of Representatives passed the measure on the 24th inst. by a vote of 119 yeas and 57 nays.

Slavery in the United States is deemed. The general amendment to the Constitution has passed both Houses of Congress. In April last it passed the Senate by a vote of 38 to 6. In June a vote was taken in the House—yeas 119, nays 57—and not receiving a two-thirds vote in the affirmative was lost.
