**The Southern Conference.**

During the session of the Democratic Convention in Richmond, a resolution was offered in favor of the Southern Conference; but it was objected to on account of the inexpediency of making a party issue out of that which, rising high above party, assumes the dignity of a State and national question. It was then agreed unanimously,

that the resolution be withdrawn from the consideration of the Convention, and submitted to a new meeting, irrespective of party, to be organized immediately after the adjournment of the Convention. Speakers from every section of the State, well qualified to express the sentiments of their constituents, addressed the meeting, in eager and unanimous approval of the measure, and never in our lives, have we seen a great question receive so unanimous endorsement from so large and enthusiastic an assembly. Almost without a dissentient voice, that vast multitude, assembled from all parts of the Commonwealth, declared concerted action on the part of the Southern States to be right, proper, just and expedient. Such a spontaneous expression of approval by the free yeomanry of Virginia, serves to confirm us in the opinion that the people of the State desire their Legislature to respond in the affirmative to the request of South Carolina and Mississippi.

Why should not Virginia go into conference with her sister Southern States? We are unable to conceive a reason, and as yet, yet, by a strange inconsistency between premise and conclusion, they declared that very measure which was to bring about the result which they themselves had pronounced necessary, was inexpedient. Southern concert of action, then, is acknowledged on all sides to be necessary, why, then, reject the Conference? Because, say some, it is a disunion movement, and expressions of Mr. Manning and others are cited to demonstrate that South Carolina is for disunion *per se*.

We are not for disunion, and hence our eager desire that Virginia, with her wise moderate and conservative counsels, should enter the Conference of her more hot-headed sisters. That a Southern Conference will be held in now a fixed fact. South Carolina, Mississippi, Alabama, and Georgia, plus even Mrs. Child and Gov. Kirkwood, as well as Seward himself—*are part owners* of all the slaves in the South, can neither be denied nor refuted that by means of these factories—supplied by Southern material—they make their bread and clothe their bodies, will scarcely be questioned.

And not one of the merchant princes of New York or Boston will dare to say that his coffee were not filled in part from the same fertile source. Now, where this "accursed institution" offers to the poor of the North meat and bread, to the less indigent, competency, and to others wealth, why it gives all them all that it has ever bestowed upon the Union, Virginia must go with them for war or for peace.

Let Virginia accede to the earnest request of her sister States. Let her go into and guide the policy of this Conference, and save the Union, under the Constitution, if possible; and if, in spite of her mild and conservative counsels, her Southern sisters wish to force (and we do not believe such a thing possible) her to an act which she cannot prove, she may return to her original position unharmed.
