WAR NEWS.

In our last we gave the latest news from a series of battles fought on the Rapidan, to the 11th inst. We were there were very few news items (Wednesday) during the day but heavy skirmishing occurred at intervals during the night. At daylight on the 12th our forces moved forward and drove the enemy's Division back a vigorous assault on Jones Brigade. For a while our lines were broken and the enemy pressed over our breastworks capturing a number of prisoners and a flag. On Tuesday they were forced back to the position of their gunboats.

From the Valley.

On Sunday last Gen. Brockenridge met the forces of Sigel, moving up the Valley, two miles this side of New Market. D. A. M. the enemy made vigorous and repeated assaults on Field's Division but were driven back with great slaughter. At 2 P. M. the front was driven back with great slaughter. For eleven consecutive hours this fight raged along our entire line, our loss is supposed to be 2000, while the great disparity of force is a fact that our troops fought behind breastworks. Grant is the first of the Union Generals who has the opportunity to attack us within our intrenchments.

Among our casualties are Gen. Ferris killed. Walker of the 6th Mass. Cavalry killed. Gen. E. Johnston and G. H. Stuart are supposed to have been captured in the first assault on our entrenchments, when the enemy gained temporary possession of the line. Wadsworth, Sedgwick, Stevenson, Hayes, killed and Webb and Getty wounded. The Washington Star of the 10th inst. states that the date by casualties and otherwise at 35,000. The Herald's correspondent on the 9th inst. says that the loss of 27,000, not including stragglers and sick, was estimated by the War Department of the Army of the Potomac to the 10th inst. it can not be less than 60,000 at present—considering the immense loss they sustained on the 10th inst. at the highest, at 15,000. The most jubilant dispatches have been sent from Grant's camp to Washington.
