17. IS A COMMON OBSERVATION that there are more sufferers from disease among Americans than can be found among any other civilized nation. The reason is obvious.

We take joy little, however, in the afflictions of our countrymen, and consider it the duty of the

FRENCH GOVERNMENT, if it should be able to regain control of NICARAGUA. He alleged that there was a perfect understanding between that government and himself, that if it would establish the institution of slavery, by law, in NICARAGUA, the French Government would see that the French commercial marine should bring to NICARAGUA as many slaves, from Africa, as could be practically carried there. He expressed the utmost confidence in this arrangement, and to C. J. RIGG'S question, "Is the Emperor of the French himself signed his agreement of the arrangement?" he answered directly, "Yes, the Emperor himself has been approached, and I have guaranteed his words precisely to him." He did not, of course indicate the clause through which the arrangement had been made—but that he placed absolute faith in it, was obvious to any one who knew him. We believe that he added to us, that there were details in the arrangement which it was needless and would be improper to mention.

An exciting discussion was held at NORFOLK, VA., on Friday, the 25th ult., by the electors of the Constitutional Union, the "Brockbridge Democratic" and the "Doughs Democratic" parties. In the course of the remarks made by Mr. LAMB, the elector of the Brockbridge Party, (who it will be remembered, appealed to Mr. DOUGLASS the famous "Norfolk Lawyer,") he stated that he (Mr. LAMB) had published his promise and proposed to some questions to Mr. BROCKBRIDGE, but that Mr. BROCKBRIDGE had declined answering them.

The Brockbridge Whig argues that if it be "the blackest treason" to answer the Norfolk questions, Mr. DOUGLASS did, as is held by some of Mr. BROCKBRIDGE's supporters, it would seem to be a very easy thing for the latter gentleman to answer them differently, and at the same time properly. It thinks that the public are entitled to answers to all these questions from Mr. BROCKBRIDGE, and that his party ought to insist upon an answer, so that every man may vote for or against Mr. BROCKBRIDGE, as they can for or against Mr. BELL and Mr. DOUGLASS, with a full knowledge of their views on a question of constitutional law.

Beverly TUCKER (brother of the Attorney General of Virginia) who it may be remembered was chosen by the Southern Democratic Senators to edit the Southern Press, a newspaper published during the latter part of the Pierce Administration,—and who at present holds the responsible position of Consul at the port of Liverpool,—has come out in a long letter in opposition to BROCKBRIDGE and strongly favoring the pretensions of Judge DOUGLASS.
