"Capt. Kagi."—We are strongly inclined to the opinion that this individual, reported among the killed in the recent insurrection at Harper's Ferry, is still living, and that it was a ruse on the part of "Gen." Brown, to say that he, and others, were among the "dead" in order to facilitate their escape.

We have another rumor to the effect that Frank J. Merriam a short time previous to the outbreak at Harper's Ferry had his bill drawn up, by an attorney in this place, bequeathing his property for the emancipation of slaves.

Arrest of Capt. Cook.—On Tuesday evening last, Messrs Cleggitt Pittsburg and D. L. Logan, of Quarrytown, in this county arrived in this place with a man in their custody who was supposed to be the fugitive John E. Cook, of Harper's Ferry, and who was arrested by the men near Mount Alto Ferry. He had left his three comrades in the mountains and was on a march for provisions when he fell in with the gentlemen above named who on that arrested him as one of the Harper's Ferry insurgents. On his way to town he made a confession of Mr. Logan and gave him his pocket-book in which were found the following papers:—

HEAD QUARTERS FOR THE DEPARTMENT, Near Harper's Ferry, Md. Warnings: John E. Cook has been nominated a Captain in the Army established under the PROCLAMATION OF GOVERNMENT, Nov. 1859. Inasmuch as the authority vested in us by said Constitution, we do hereby appoint and commission said John E. Cook, Captain.

Given at the office of the Secretary of War, this 2d day of Nov. 1859. JOHN BROWN, Commander-in-Chief. H. KAUF, Secretary of War. Another paper was a receipt, as follows: Received of Mr. John E. Cook, two dollars, on account of notes. Wm J. STRATTON, Secretary, 1859.

Goods amounting to \$11.00. A bill of sale for the above amount, endorsed by Alfred Burton, payable six months from date, which will be January 8, 1860. The above paper, all but the signature, is in a very fine hand—doubtless written by a female. The signature is in a bold, legible hand—very distinct, and in the handwriting of a man. Another important paper was found in his pocket-book. A small piece of parchment, about six inches long and one and a half broad, with a string tied in one end of it, and it was written in a legible hand, the following: "One of a pair of pistols, procured by Gen. Lafayette to Gen. Washington, and worn by Gen. W. during the Revolution—descended to George Washington, and by him to Lewis W. Washington, 1859."

The pocket-book also has the following written inside of it in bold letters: "John E. Cook, Harper's Ferry." There were several other papers in the pocket-book, containing drawings of roads, etc., about Harper's Ferry. After the testimony of Logan and Pittsburg had been taken, and the papers read before the Jury, Mr. Auginbaugh, formerly of Hagerstown, one of the jurymen who stated that he recognized the prisoner as a man who had been introduced to him in Hagerstown about nine months ago as Mr. Cook. The testimony here closed, and the prisoner was committed to jail, followed by a large crowd to the prison door.

Departure of Capt. Cook.—On Thursday last Capt. John E. Cook was given over to the authorities of Virginia upon a requisition from Gov. Wm. He left here at noon on that day under a strong guard which detained him safely in the jail at Charlottesville. He was in good spirits all the way except at one time when some allusion was made to his wife as he was observed to shed tears. He talked very freely of the insurrection and related many incidents connected with it, and also entertained his guard with an account of many of his exploits in Kansas. There seems to be a strong feeling springing up in this community in favor of Cook as a man who had been in the ranks of the insurrection and related many incidents connected with it, and also entertained his guard with an account of many of his exploits in Kansas.

A lady said to be Cook's sister, and her husband a wealthy merchant of New York, and another gentleman said to be Gov. Willard, of Indiana, who is a brother-in-law to Cook visited this place the day previous to Cook being arrested. They were in search of him and had been informed that he was in this place. They did not find him here and left immediately. The next day Cook was arrested and brought to town a prisoner. His friends did not return here after his arrest but we see by the papers that they are now with him at Charlottesville.

The Insurgents About.—On Thursday morning last three boys, while hunting in Beatty's woods, a short distance from this borough, found three Sharps Rifles and a quantity of ammunition concealed in the bushes. The boys returning with their booty a party from town repaired to the spot and made a more thorough search. A large lot of ammunition was picked up, some bloody bandages were lying around, a book and some other articles were also found. One of the Rifles had the name of C. P. Tidd on the mounting. The book is a copy of "A. F. Persons" marked on the end with ink. This man was a member of the Provisional Convention held at Chambersburg, in 1859, on the 15th of May 1859. The party who placed these rifles in, in the bushes are said to be Tidd, Copper, one of the Browns, and another man about whom reports differ—some have him white and others black. This is the party who were in company with Capt. Cook. They followed him to this place after his capture on Thursday night and remained in concealment in this neighborhood until Friday morning. How they left or what course they took is not known.
