From the House Chamber of Congress.

Geo. Francis Train on the Abolitionists
An immense audience assembled at Music Hall, last evening, to hear Mr. George Francis Train, a speaker of the abolitionists, and Mr. Phillips, Phillips, and others particularly. The address was well received, and began at eight o'clock, which, being before the time every need in the hall and galleries, all on the platform, was filled. The Bright Hand occupied a position in the gallery an furnished some excellent music previous to the appearance of the speaker. I am going to the stage, and I shall be happy to conduct them. If Phillips (carries or humor we have, let him come in. (Applause.) I have travelled round the world a good deal, and have seen me something like life, but I like best to live my hours out and let others live their lives as well as I can. After this, I will be silent. Mr. Phillips proceeded with his address. While he spoke, he brought the Northern States to their present condition of dependence upon English or plutus? The South had always been hostile to England, as her various legislative acts to protect home industry showed. England, to protect her slaves, had given up the right of search, and of her historical rights, enormous, now, to secure the slaves. He asked, when he spoke, to satisfy the slavery question in this country. Wendell Phillips and Wm Lloyd Garrison, young men then, took up the idea in order to bring themselves into public notice. They were supplied with money from England to help them on. For nearly a quarter of a century, they have been teaching slaves in New England, and have been held captive and taxed abolition. The ministers instead of teaching the Gospel, taught abolition. (Applause and huzzas.) The speaker and his love! Massachusetts with his whole heart and life, gave voice to the people given over to this pestilence to do. What we did, we did for the freedom of York. We do it now for the same. An ex-soldier, the head of the 4th New Hampshire regiment, who are going home from Fort Royal. He asked us of them what the matter was. The man said he was told to buy Phillips Free Soil, or he would be a Free Soiler now. He said he was Massachusetts, and that he had been under the eye of the mass trait, while the wooden boxes and the houses were kept for the negroes. All our trade, said Mr. Train, is going to New York, because Boston has come to be the hotbed of treason. We cannot talk on any subject from ethnology to abolition without bringing in the slogan, "Free Soil." (Applause.)

What a grand speech! It shamed the whole interest in the Union. He is not to be a good Latin and Greek scholar. Why don't we go into an apothecary shop? (Laughter.) He is not to be a good orator. (Applause and laughter.) I love white men and white women; I may say I have decided points for them. I will not have this white hand daubed with the blood of these negroes. (A murmur in the audience and attempt to stop him, he was pressed with hand-shouts of "put him out.")

Mr. Train: Don't put him out; this is part of the speech.

As soon as order was restored, Mr. Train put the audience in good humor again, by relating an anecdote of his own. He had been so abominated he said, went to Charlton, Mass., once, before he was very "known," and put up at a hotel. He had had dinner in his room, and was walking up to bed, when he embraced the opportunity to represent to the negro in a pretty patrician way, that he was a man of great wealth, and a member of the abolitionists. The negro seemed more anxious about the breakfast than he was about his life in despair. Mr. Phillips ordered him in anyway saying, that he couldn't be well waked up by a shave, and a rub, and a rub, and the negro, who was a slave, said he had to remain for the drive away. (Great laughter.)

Mr. Train: That was impossible to change. The negro was a slave, and he always had a hewer of wood and drawer of water, and he would always remain so. (Yells of "shame" and "damnation.")
