COUNTERFEIT GREENBACKS.—Among the numerous counterfeits that are photographs of real dollar treasury notes, they are well calculated to deceive, and would not be detected at a casual glance by one man out of five hundred. Compared closely with the genuine bills, they appear to be about a sixteenth of an inch longer, and the paper thicker and stiff.

The signatures show great care, and the shading of the engraving is heavier and darker. Others would probably be detected on a very critical examination. It is likely that these counterfeits have obtained a wide circulation both at home and abroad, and it will be necessary for people to be a little more careful in handling "greenbacks" than they have heretofore been.

HIGHLY IMPORTANT TO DRAFTED MEN.—The Atlantic Special Order had been issued by the Adjutant General of the United States Army. Those interested had better take heed:

ARMED GUARDS.—MILWAUKEE, Wis., Nov. 26, 1862.—All drafted men who have not yet enlisted at the camp of rendezvous will immediately do so. The commencement of their time will be set by the adjutant general from the date of their report for duty.

2. Drafted men and their relatives who have left the camp of rendezvous without an identity as deserters. If apprehended, they will be required to make good the time lost by desertion, and be subject to trial by General Court-Martial.
