

A United Public Sentiment.

We have a great deal said these days about a united public sentiment, and, I suppose, as well as the rest of the country, we are anxious to know what it means. In conversation, a few days ago, with a soldier just from the Army of the Potomac, we inquired as to the condition of the army. He replied that it was disheartened and demoralized beyond conception, that no one but the soldiers themselves had any idea of the extent of the demoralization, and added: "They can't help but feel that they are not worth fighting for what they enlisted to fight for."

But says some fanatical Abolitionist, the soldiers have no right to *feel* in this way, and the people of the country have no right to condemn the policy of the administration. They ought to submit without a murmur and ask no questions. This is, in effect, saying that the people, as well as the soldiers, ought all to be slaves and fools.
